

DEDICATION OF A PARSONAGE

Minister (or Bishop):

“Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any one hear my voice, and opens the door, I will come in, ...” The work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance forever, and my people shall dwell in a peaceable habitation, and in sure dwellings, and in quiet resting places.

People: Loving Father, hear our prayer.

Bishop: And so, Father, praying to you that the sheltering of the family that has a blessed and unique relationship to You, the Church, and this community; praying that this house will stand for spiritual enrichment to all who cross its threshold; praying that this house may fulfill a vital role in creating and maintaining good fellowship within the parish; praying that it may help to enhance the ability and faithfulness of those who in it reside, that there may be wise conduct of the affairs of the congregation, and seeking the manifest presence of Your Holy Spirit within its walls always, we now dedicate this parsonage, in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
