SACRAMENT OF INFANT BAPTISM

Christian baptism is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ and administered by the church from its beginning. The formal application of water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is a sign and seal to recognize that the person so consecrated stands in a holy covenant relation to God and His people. Recognizing this child (or these children) as under the atonement of Christ and as a part of the spiritual family of God, we consider (him, her or them) (a) worthy subject(s) for Christian baptism.

The Baptism:

Let us pay reverent attention to the reading from God's Word: "People were bringing little children to Jesus to have him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' And he took the children in his arms, put his hands on them and blessed them." (Mark 10:13-16)

As parents presenting your child for baptism you signify your own personal faith in Jesus Christ; you bear witness to your belief that the child stands in holy covenant relation to God and His people through the finished work of Christ, and you publicly affirm the reality of God's grace at work in the life of your child.
