THE FUNERAL SERVICE

A BASIC SERVICE OF THANKSGIVING AND HOPE

- 1. Call to Worship
- 2. Invocation
- 3. Hymn
- 4. Reading of Old Testament Scriptures
- 5. Musical presentation (if desired)
- 6. Reading of New Testament Scriptures
- 7. Thanksgiving for the Life
- 8. Response from the family (if desire)
- 9. Prayers, including the Lord's Prayer
- 10. Hymn or musical presentation (as desired)
- 11. Meditation and challenge
- 12. Hymn
- 13. Dedication

THESE RUBICS MAY BE HELPFUL:

- Appropriate music prior to and following the service
- Appropriate poetry may be used as desired in place of line 5
- The message is an evangelistic opportunity in which persons may be invited to receive Jesus Christ as their Savior.
- The Apostle's Creed or other Statement of Faith may be used following line 3.
- The Lord's Supper may be inserted following line 11 if desired. This would include the invitation, prayer of consecration and the distribution of elements.

The Committal:

The service of committal is not meant to be an extension, let alone a recapitulation of the funeral or memorial. Rather, it is a reminder of what has been already affirmed; hope, for the Christian, is hope grounded in Jesus' victory over death.

It is important to leave the sorrowing family and friends with a firm sense of closure while reassuring them once again that, for those who are in Jesus Christ, there is no final goodbye.

The service proposed here is in four parts:

- 1. One or two scripture sentences
- 2. The words of committal (which will vary according to the disposition of the body)
- 3. A brief prayer of committal
- 4. A benediction

COMMITTALS:

For earth burial:

In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister (Name); and we commit his/her body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

For burial at sea:

In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister (Name); and we commit his/her body to the deed.

For cremation:

In the name of the our Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, we commend to God's merciful care our brother/sister (Name); and we commit his/her body to be returned to the elements, ashes to ashes. (If committal takes place in a columbarium substitute: "We commit his/her ashes to their final resting place.")

SUGGESTED SCRIPTURE SENTENCES:

SUGGESTED PRAYERS:

You sent your Son, Jesus Christ, to bring life and immortality to light. We entrust (Name) to your everlasting care. Grant us the awareness that each of our days is a true gift from you, to be lived preciously and joyously in hopeful expectation of eternal life in divine presence with those whom we love. In the name of Jesus, the Lord of life, we pray. Amen.

O LORD, support us all the day long, until the shadows lengthen, and the evening comes, and the busy world is hushed, and the fever of life is over, and our work is done. Then, in your mercy, grant us a safe lodging, and a holy rest, and peace at the last; through Jesus Christ, our LORD. Amen.
